

# Easy Guitar Chords

The following guitar chords are easier to play as they are in easier positions, require you to use fewer fingers and **you only strum the three strings closest to your feet.**

**Key:**

- ① Finger number & placement on string
- X Do not play this string
- O Open string - play string with no fingers
- ① ① ① Place finger flat across (*barre*) the strings

# Easy Guitar Chords

## How to read guitar chord diagrams:

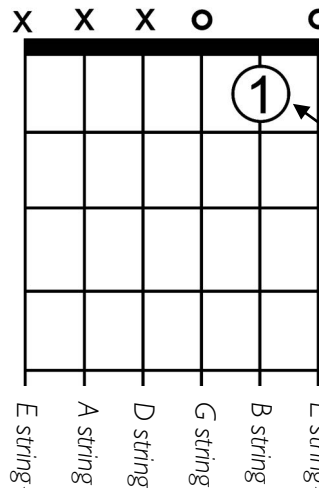
The name of the chord.

A small 'm' indicates a minor chord, e.g. 'Am'

**C**  
(Easy)

'X' means do not play this string

fret 1 →  
fret 2 →  
fret 3 →  
fret 4 →



'O' indicates an 'open' string (play the string with no fingers on this string)

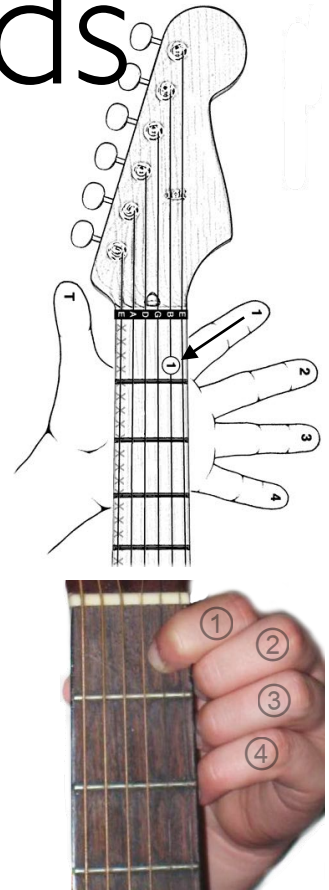
The 'nut'; indicates the top of the fretboard

These circled numbers tell you which finger of your left hand to use and which fret/string to place that finger on.

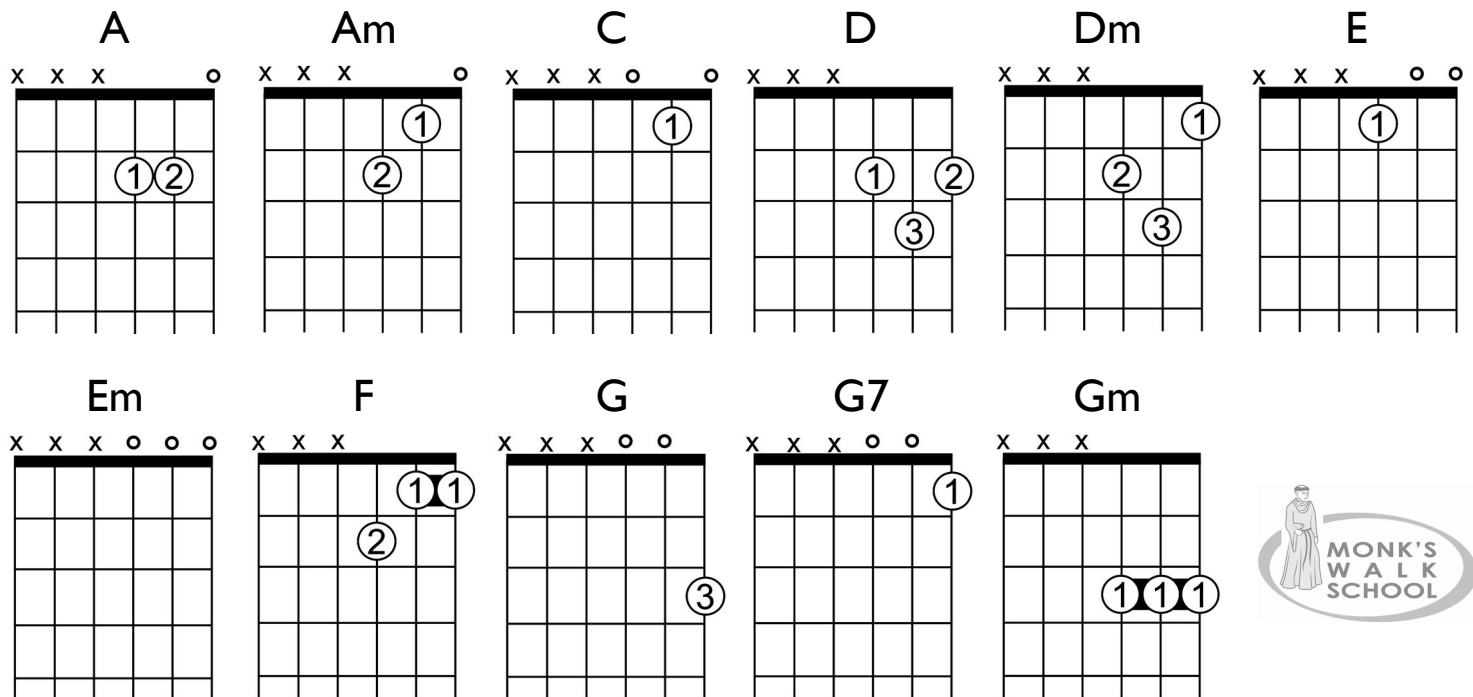


The string closest to your chin
